



9) Speed reduction in village –

- a) Fyning Lane
 - TRO submitted and additional queries answered.
 - Concern raised by WSCC Highways are 20mph signs installed – have clarified design ok but some were on highways land; these are being moved to private land.
 - b) Hillbrow Road – 30mph TRO application has now been submitted.
 - c) Rogate village centre Community Highways Scheme 20mph zone application – following last month's meeting we received confirmation
 - Parsonage Estate would be included
 - altering the church wall would be complicated and therefore need a specific application
 - Highways appear satisfied with the NP survey responses
- Therefore, we have sent letter of support via James Stock who has submitted the application ahead of the 31 July deadline.

10) Emergency 'warm space' provision – at last month's meeting we were informed there is insufficient insurance to allow a member of the public to share their generator. Query still with the hall.

11) R&T monthly letter from Parish Council – following last month's discussion do we think this responsibility should be shared between all the councillors.

12) SDNP Councillor representative – Andrew Shaxson and Alun Aylesbury as West Sussex parish representatives on the board. Have asked him to request the nomination and election process is reviewed in view of the problems and concerns raised.

13) Operation Watershed – North Street (bottom end) road closure – 14/8/2023-01/09/2023 – this will be in place 24/7 - is there anything we/the village can do to help?

14) Parsonage entrance wildflower area – concerns were raised about the height of the flowers but sight lines were checked to be within highways guidelines and were due to be cut in two weeks. Disappointingly, it appears members of the public have taken action and cut 85% of the flowers in full bloom damaging the roots and destroying the work from the last couple of years. This is very disheartening, given the hours of Nick's time, money and energy for this project. How can we support project and parishioners?

15) Recreation playground litter bin – concern raised about the contents and litter/dog waste around the Recreation Ground. Our playground bin is currently the only bin on the Recreation Ground and is emptied by a volunteer on an honorarium basis which no longer seems appropriate.

- CDC –offer a bin emptying service - if bin meets their requirements. Cost of installed bin £450+vat (though can purchase direct if able to install) and emptying £1.78+vat per week. Are unable to offer immediate service start but could go on their waiting list.
- Clerk spoke to Hall who have experienced problems with rubbish being dumped in their commercial bin. Have suggested they consider installing another litter bin so the area would be served by two bins.

19) SDNP Litter picking equipment grant – Trotton PC have made a successful grant application for litter picking equipment and suggested we may want to do the same and possibly made a pool of equipment to share between local councils.
